

### temples in the archipelago. Built by the community through collective work parties known as "mingas," this church

led to the belief that the church was erected over a cemetery or that some faithful from the area were buried under the old temple.

Among the church's images, the 'Seated Virgin,' representing the Immaculate Conception on a wooden throne, stepping on a demon in the form of a serpent, stands out. This image is unique in the archipelago and is directly associated with the locality, as the Mapudungun name of Vilupulli translates to 'Hill of the snake' or 'Serpent's hill.'



It is also recounted that Charles Darwin visited the church of Vilupulli in 1843.








